How to Play

The game begins with players placing an 'Ante' wager in the corresponding areas on the table layout prior to any cards being dealt. Players also have the option of placing a Jackpot

Two hole cards are then dealt to each player face down. When all hole cards have been dealt, players can then look at the cards but must not show them to the Dealer or other players.

Players review their cards and decide to 'bet' or 'fold.' If they fold, they forfeit their Ante.

If the player chooses to bet, they must make a further bet, one to three times their Ante wager. This is called the "3rd Street Wager."

Once all players have made their decisions, the Dealer will then turn over the 3rd Street card.

Players once again decide to bet or fold. If the player chooses to bet, they must make another further bet, one to three times their Ante wager. This is called the "4th Street Wager."

The Dealer will then turn over the 4th Street card.

Finally, the players decide again whether to bet or fold. If the player chooses to bet, they must make a final bet, one to three times their Ante wager. This is called a "5th Street Wager."

The Dealer will then turn over the 5th Street card. This concludes the betting round.

To determine the payouts, the Dealer will turn over and spread the players hole cards and announce the best possible fivecard Poker hand, using the players two hole cards and the 3rd, 4th and 5th Street cards.

The Ante and all Street Wagers are paid according to the Payout Odds.

About the Game

Crown Sydney offers a variety of poker games. Mississippi Stud is a form of poker with similarities to the traditional Five-Card Stud Poker but with small differences.




Game Overview

The objective of Mississippi Stud is to make the best Five-Card Poker hand possible where the higher the hand ranking, the greater the payout. There is no need to beat another player or the Dealer, however a minimum hand ranking of a Pair of 6's is required.

Each game has a house edge. This is the overall percentage of money wagered that is expected to be retained by the casino. The lower the house edge, the higher the proportion of money that is returned to the players.

Mississippi Stud played at Crown Sydney has a house edge of approximately 1.37% excluding side wagers.

Hand Examples

POKER HAND	DESCRIPTION	HAND EXAMPLE
Royal Flush	The top five consecutive cards in the deck, all of the same suit.	
Straight Flush	Five consecutive cards of the same suit (other than a Royal Flush).	
Four of a Kind	Any four cards of the same face value.	
Full House	Any three cards of the same face value and any two cards of the same face value.	
Flush	Any five cards of the same suit not running consecutively.	
Straight	Five cards of two or more suits running consecutively.	
Three of a Kind	Any three cards of the same face value and two other cards of different values.	\$ 10 PM

Hand Examples

POKER HAND	DESCRIPTION	HAND EXAMPLE
Two Pairs	Any two cards of the same face value, plus another two cards of the same face value (but different from the first pair) plus any other card.	
Pair of Jacks or Higher	Any two cards of the same face value that are a Jack or higher.	
Pair of 6's-10's	Any two cards of the same face value that have a value between 6 and 10 (inclusive) plus three other cards of different values.	

Glossary

Ante – An initial wager placed by the player.

Bet – The player elects to remain in the game by placing an additional wager after the cards have been dealt.

Fold – A decision by a player to no longer continue with their hand for that particular round of play and to forfeit all wagers. If the game is being dealt in accordance with Method B*, a player who folds will still be eligible to win any relevant jackpot payouts if their hand qualifies for such a payment. Hole Cards – The first two (2) cards that are dealt to each player.

Jackpot – Crown Sydney may operate a Jackpot for Poker Minor games. Jackpot bets are optional wagers for the player and must be placed to be eligible for the chance to win the Jackpot prize.

Street – One (1) of the three (3) betting rounds occurring in the subsequent deal, where a player may place an additional wager in order to continue in the Round of Play.

*Method B – means method of dealing cards relevant to the jackpot (if any) offered on the table. If the jackpot is linked across multiple Poker Minor games, Method B must be used.
